INTRODUCTION

As 2016 begins, the zones and countries that comprise the area recognized as FMD-free in South America remains without FMD episodes for over four years; while for over two years, there have been no reports of FMD episodes in the zones and countries that have not yet achieved FMD-free status recognition. This scenario certainly reflects the significant progress achieves by the national programs and the 2011-2020 action plan of the Hemispheric Program for the Eradication of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (PHEFA). Indeed, 85 percent of the territory and 95 percent of the cattle herds of the South America Region have been recognized by OIE as FMD-free, with or without vaccination. The patterns of FMD occurrence, both endemic and sporadic, characteristic of the previous decade, have given way to a long absence of clinical episodes in the countries with control programs. Similarly, the surveillance systems of countries whose FMD-free status is officially recognized, report a sustained absence of transmission and infection in their herds.

As the first half of the PHEFA 2011-2020 Action Plan ended, it became clear that FMD eradication process in the Region had advanced faster than expected. Thus, the Seminar of the 42nd COSALFA Meeting, held in Quito in April 2015, found that there was a need for reviewing the current situation and for forecasting expected scenarios for the next five years Plan of Action.

Thus, the countries decided that PANAFTOSA-PAHO/WHO should convene a Group of Experts for drafting, under its technical orientation and coordination, a proposal of a Technical Work Guide that designates the technical and epidemiological lineaments and methods for addressing the major challenges the countries and the subregion are expected to face in PHEFA's last phase.

As the Technical Guide was approved, it was proposed by the countries that the theme of the Pre-COSALFA 43 International Seminar should address the methods to be followed by the countries in the implementation of the components of the **Technical Work Guide for PHEFA's Last Phase**, thus facilitating their application by the Region's veterinary services.

The Seminar agenda is broken down into sessions devoted to the components of the Technical Guide, whose methodologic elements will be addressed by major international figures and by members of the Group of Experts, together with presentations on experiences and studies carried out in the region. Each session will end with a discussion, when the main actors will air their opinions about the methods and identify the challenges and the needs associated with the implementation by the countries and within the region under PHEFA's 2011-2020 Action Plan.
