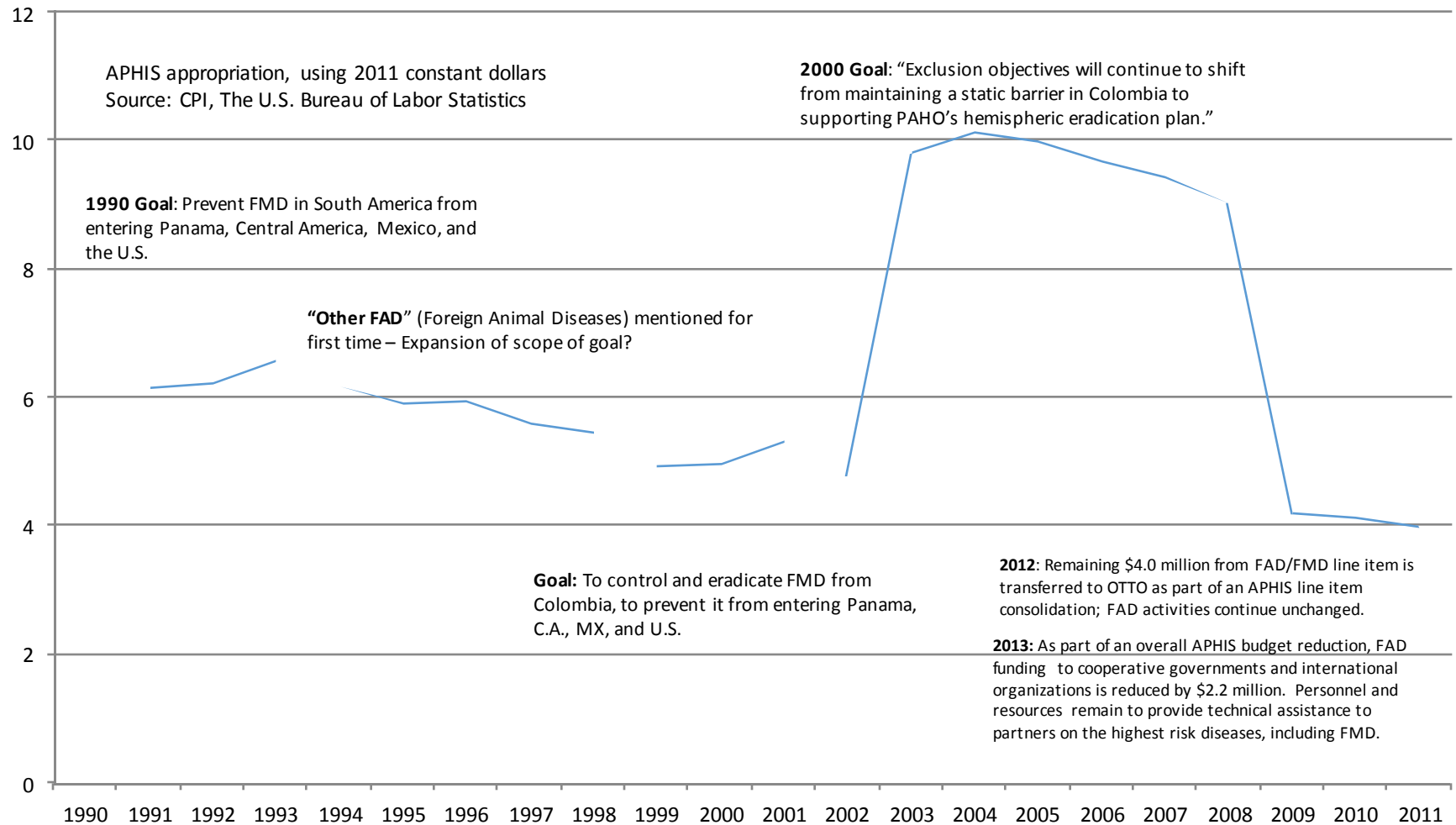
Plan Estratégico de APHIS IS 2011- 2016

**TECHNICAL SERVICES
AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE PAN AMERICAN HEALTH ORGANIZATION (PAHO) / CENTRO
PANAMERICANO DE FIEBRE AFTOSA (PANAFOSA)
AND
THE
UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (USDA),
ANIMAL AND PLANT HEALTH INSPECTION SERVICE
(APHIS)**

This Technical Services Agreement is made and entered into by and between the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) / Centro Panamericano de Fiebre Aftosa ("Pan-American Center for Foot-and-Mouth Disease), hereinafter referred to as PAHO/PANAFOSA, and the United States Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, hereinafter referred to as APHIS.

ARTICLE 1 - PURPOSE

USDA, APHIS is providing technical services and assistance by way of International Transboundary Animal Disease Course (ITAD) to PAHO/PANAFOSA, which will be held at The Plum Island Animal Disease Center (PIADC), Orient Point, New York, from September 12-26, 2015. The course is offered to enhance participants' skills and abilities to perform their occupational duties as veterinary medical officers. Students are instructed in the fundamentals of clinical examinations of animals inoculated with selected transboundary animal diseases, differential diagnosis of transboundary animal diseases, post-mortem examination of inoculated animals, transboundary animal disease sampling techniques, and biosecure packaging and shipping techniques for biological samples.

ARTICLE 2 - AUTHORITY

Under the Animal Health Protection Act (AHPA), as amended, (7 USC §§ 830) et. seq.), the Secretary of Agriculture is authorized to issue regulations and orders and to carry out operations and measures to prevent, detect, control, and eradicate diseases and pests of livestock and to cooperate with other Federal agencies, States or political subdivisions of States, national governments of foreign countries, local governments of foreign countries, domestic or international organizations, domestic or international associations, Indian tribes and other persons to carry out the purposes of the AHPA.

Under the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriation Act, 2015 (Pub. L. 113-235), APHIS is authorized to collect fees to cover the total costs of providing technical assistance, goods, or services requested by States, other political subdivisions, domestic or international organizations, foreign governments, or individuals, provided that such fees are structured such that any entity's liability for such fees is reasonably based on the technical assistance, goods, or services provided to the entity by the Agency, and such fees shall be credited to this account, to remain available until expended, without further appropriation, for providing such assistance, good, or services.

6. Amounts as stated in the previous paragraph shall be calculated on the number of days from the day after the due date to the date of completion, at an annual rate of 3.0% of the amount stated in Article 6B.

**ARTICLE 12 - NEGOTIATIONS IN THE EVENT OF
DISPUTES**

In the case of any dispute between the parties under this Agreement, the parties shall make their best mutual effort to resolve the issue informally. In the event of a dispute, the APHIS Administrator will discuss with the PAHO Director to come to a mutually agreed conclusion.

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the United States. Except as provided in Article 10(B), none of the terms or requirements of this agreement or its attachments shall be governed by international law.

**ARTICLE 13 - DURATION, REVISES, EXTENSIONS, AND
TERMINATIONS**

This Agreement shall become effective the date of final signature, and shall continue one year from that date. Further, this Agreement may be amended or extended at any time by mutual agreement and signature of both the parties in writing. PAHO/PANAFOSA must submit a written request in external at least 30 days prior to expiration of the agreement. It may be terminated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party.
