



PRE-REDIPRA SEMINAR "THE EXPERIENCE OF COUNTRIES AND TOOLS FOR THE DECLARATION OF CANINE RABIES VARIANTS 1 AND 2 FREE AREAS"

Brasília, Brazil, September 15 - 2015

OBJECTIVES

Since the beginning of the regional rabies control program in 1983, the cases of human rabies associated with variants 1 and 2 are at historic lows in the Americas. The majority of the countries and areas in the region report no cases of human rabies by variants 1 and 2, and cases are restricted to a small number of areas.

The objective of the Seminar is to discuss a model for the declaration of canine-transmitted rabies free areas in the region, considering the World Health Organization's (WHO) requirements developed in a consult with rabies specialists (WHO, 2013), the experience of the countries and, the compilation of indicators by PANAFTOSA-PAHO/WHO.

As many of the WHO's requirements are focused on a canine surveillance, the University of Glasgow will present the (provisional) results of the modelling work for a definition of surveillance standards. This study was commissioned by PAHO and WHO, and independent of an area's epidemiologic rabies situation, the model results could be applicable for the elaboration of canine surveillance programs.
