Informal group of international stakeholders in Rabies Control, founded in 2008







Estimated Burden of rabies


Human Deaths per year:AfricaAsiaLatin America21,50237,266182



Hampson et al (2015) Plos NTD




Estimated Regional burden of rabies

End Rabies Now campaign

Aims to :

- significantly raise the profile of rabies as a global health challenge
- bring international stakeholders together to this end
- support efforts to gain the active commitment of highlevel politicians to advocate for and support rabies elimination
- secure funds to support national governments;

Focus on global elimination of canine-mediated human rabies through dog vaccination.

Set to launch later this year.
